Parking Permit Date Extended

Students who wish to drive must complete a Parking Permit Application and submit to Herndon Career Center. The parking permit must be placed in the lower corner of the windshield on the passenger side.

To continue our discussion of the IEP, we begin with the Present Level. This is where the IEP team (student, parent, teachers, case manager, administrator, etc.) discuss the student's specific area of eligibility and their strengths and weaknesses. As we determine the student's challenges, they will be addressed again in the goals and how we are going to work with the student to improve each area. Strengths of the student should be incorporated into the post-secondary plan later in the IEP. This section is where the parent also gets to provide their concerns. Be ready to provide this information. This continues into the sub-section of the student's changes in current functioning. The team will discuss the goals of the previous IEP, where they started, their current status, and if the goal will need to continue or not. For your secondary student, this section will also discuss current grades, credits earned toward graduation, and where they stand with the completion of statewide tests required for graduation. We finish this area with a condensed version of the most recent cognitive and academic evaluation testing of the student and how they qualify for their specific area(s) of special education. It is the Present Level section that really drives the rest of the IEP. Next week we will continue this discussion. Have a great week!
